Extreme weather conditions e.g. high winds, rain, cold	Staff / pupils	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Teacher / coach to use professional judgement to assess if the weather conditions are appropriate for activity to commence / continue. 	Low	

Direct sunlight, high temperatures / Sunburn, sunstroke, dehydration		<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Students reminded to take their water bottles to the area and to use sun protection -refer to school policy • Regular breaks to be taken from activity • Pupils not participating to wait in shaded areas • Staff to wear appropriate clothing, use sun protection and increase fluid intake 	Low	
Damaged unstable outdoor goal posts / multiple injuries	Pupils	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Inspected prior to use • Correctly located and securely fixed to the ground • Net fixings suitable and secure • Pupils prohibited from climbing or swinging off goalposts and given guidance on the dangers 	Low	
Unsecured portable goal posts / multiple injuries	Pupils	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Inspected prior to use • Secured as per manufacturers instructions • Pupils prohibited from climbing or swinging off goalposts and given guidance on the dangers 	Low	
Litter, glass / injuries, cuts	Pupils/ Staff/ Spectators/ Visitors	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Inspection of area by staff before use • Litter-picking carried out as required 	Medium	
Ground surface defects e.g. holes / trips, injury	Pupils/ Staff/ Spectators/ Visitors	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Regular inspections of area and inspection by staff before use • Reporting procedure for any defects • Prompt remedial action 	Low	
Post socket holes / slips & trips / injury	Pupils/ Staff/ Spectators/ Visitors	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Post sockets sunk below playing level surface • Post socket holes appropriately covered and flush with level of ground 	Low	

Drainage (Adequate) / slips & trips / water logging	Pupils/ Staff/ Spectators/ Visitors	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Regular inspection of area • Reporting procedure for any defects • Prompt remedial action • Alternative area to be used if water logged 	Low	
Pupils with pre existing medical conditions /injuries	Pupils	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Staff made aware of all pupils with medical conditions • Pupils reminded to bring inhalers, epipens etc • Staff to have access to specific pupil risk assessment for pupils with more serious conditions and to adapt activity for them accordingly • First aider available on site • Procedures in place to call for immediate help • First aid kit available 	Medium
